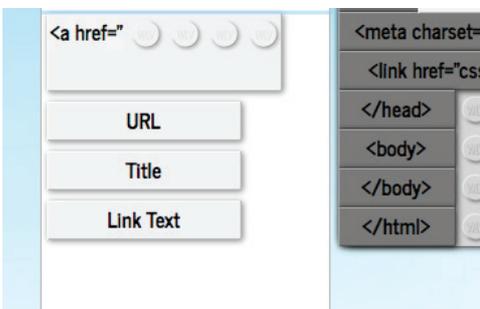
## 1. Get started



The World Wide Web is a system which allows web pages to link to other web pages. So lets link your web page to others on the web.

Click the rubbish bin to clear your page.

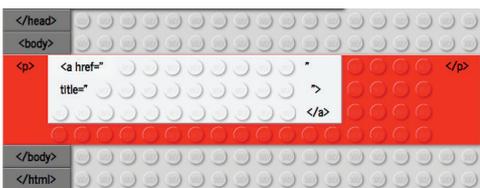
## 2. The “a” tag



The link block, `<a>`, is a content tag which goes inside other blocks, rather than on its own (such as an `<h1>` tag).

Drag a `<p>` tag into the Code Area, than drag an `<a>` tag on top of it from the “Links” section of the Block Box.

## 3. Understanding the “a” tag



The `<a>` tag has three attributes:

`href` - the web address of the page you're linking to

`title` - the name of the page you're linking to. This is displayed when you hold your pointer over a link

`link text` - the text which is displayed on your page and is clicked by the user

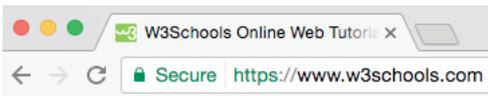
## 4. Add content blocks



Lets add the web address to the `<a>` tag. First, drag the URL content block onto the `<a>` block in the code area. It snaps into the correct place. Do the same for the Title and Link Text blocks.

“Link Text” will appear in the output window.

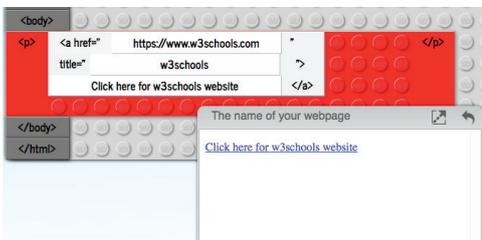
## 5. Adding a URL



The URL is the web address of the page we’re linking to. Click on the URL block and type a web address to link to.

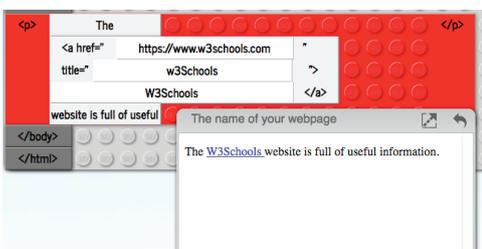
Note that some websites cannot be displayed in the output window. `https://www.w3schools.com` is a good address to use. Remember to include “`https://www.`” to the start.

## 6. Adding a picture



Edit the Title and Link Text blocks to provide suitable information.

## 7. Including a link in more text



You may want a link as part of other text. Try creating a new paragraph and adding some text, then a link, then some more text.

Links can also be added headlines and lists in Weggo.
